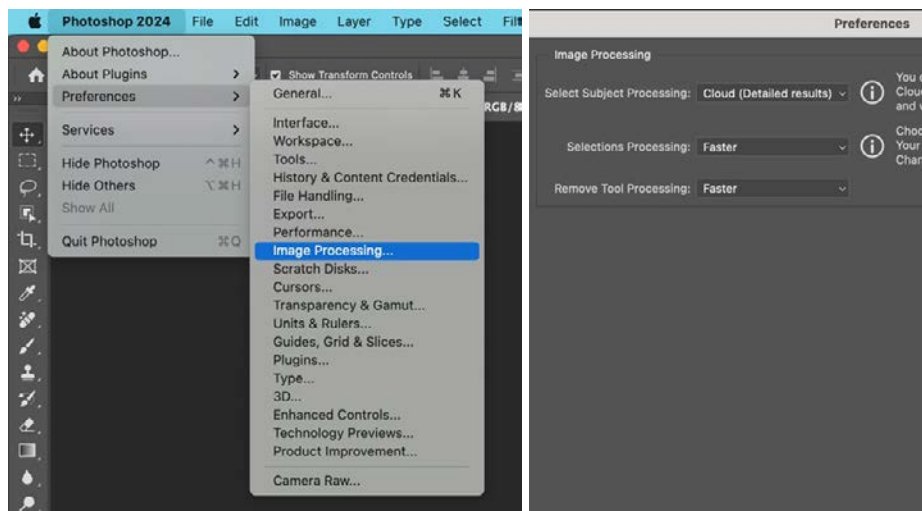

Photoshop and AI

Selection Preferences

I think it is best to always use Cloud Select Subject (or Remove Background) for better selections. To do this, change the Photoshop Preferences:

1. Go to Photoshop > Settings > Image Processing (macOS) or Edit > Preferences > Image Processing (Windows).
2. Change Select Subject Processing to Cloud (Detailed results).
3. Restart Photoshop.

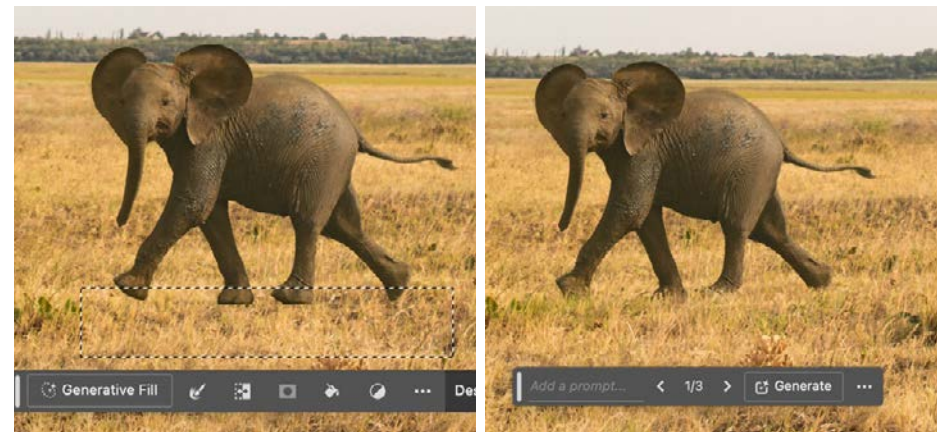


Blending Images

Generative Fill is great for blending images in photo compositions. To blend images, follow these steps:

1. Make a selection around the objects you'd like to blend.

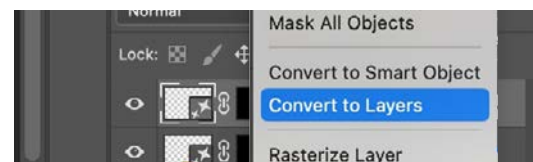
2. Click Generative Fill in the Contextual Taskbar.
3. Click Generate.
4. Choose the best variation.



Convert Generative Fill layer into layers

A Generative Fill layer is actually a Smart Object. You can convert a smart object into layers if you want to do something with those layers, such as reselect and mask the layer. This is how you do it:

1. Right click a Generative Fill layer in the Layers panel.
2. Choose Convert to Layers.
3. Choose the desired layer from the newly created layer group.



Prevent errors when removing objects

Generative Fill is great for removing objects. Make a selection around the object you'd like to delete, click Generative Fill and then Generate to delete.

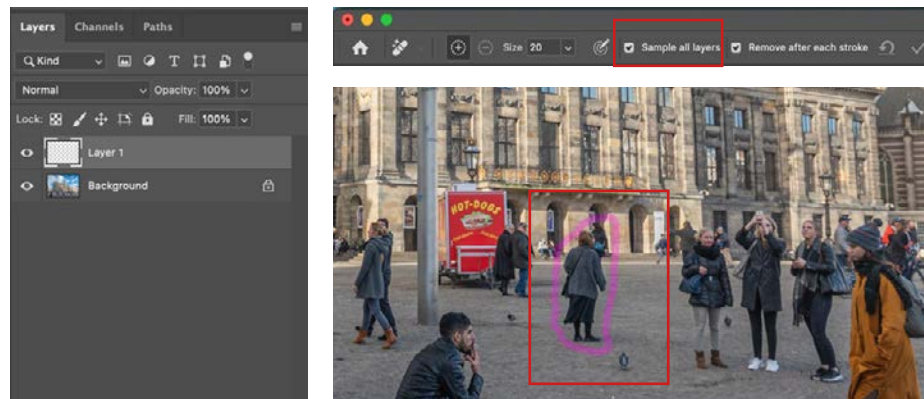
Unfortunately, this sometimes gives crazy results. And this is usually due to shadows not being included in the selection. Do you want to remove objects? Then make sure that all shadows are also in the selection!



Working non destructively with the Remove Tool

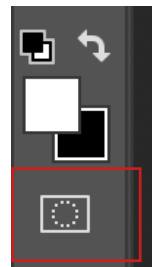
The new Remove Tool is also great at removing objects. I prefer working non destructively with this tool. This is how you do it:

1. Create a new layer.
2. Select the Remove Tool in the toolbar.
3. In the Options Bar, check Sample all Layers.
4. Now start painting on top of the objects you'd like to remove.
5. Want quicker results? Paint a "lasso" with the Remove tool, and Photoshop will remove everything within this lasso.

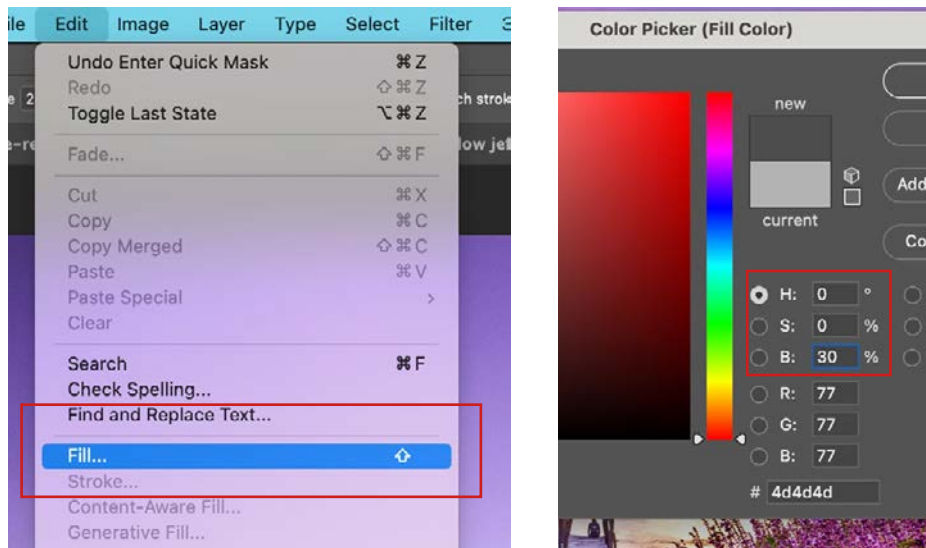


Watercolor painting with Generative Fill

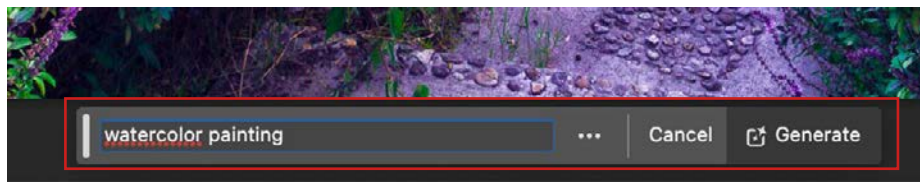
1. Go to Quick Mask Mode (Q).



2. Fill with 30% Brightness/dark grey (Edit > Fill > Color).



3. Exit Photoshop Quick Mask Mode (Q). You now have a 30% opaque selection (you don't see it, but it's there).
4. Use Generative Fill with a prompt like: "watercolor painting", hit return or click Generate.

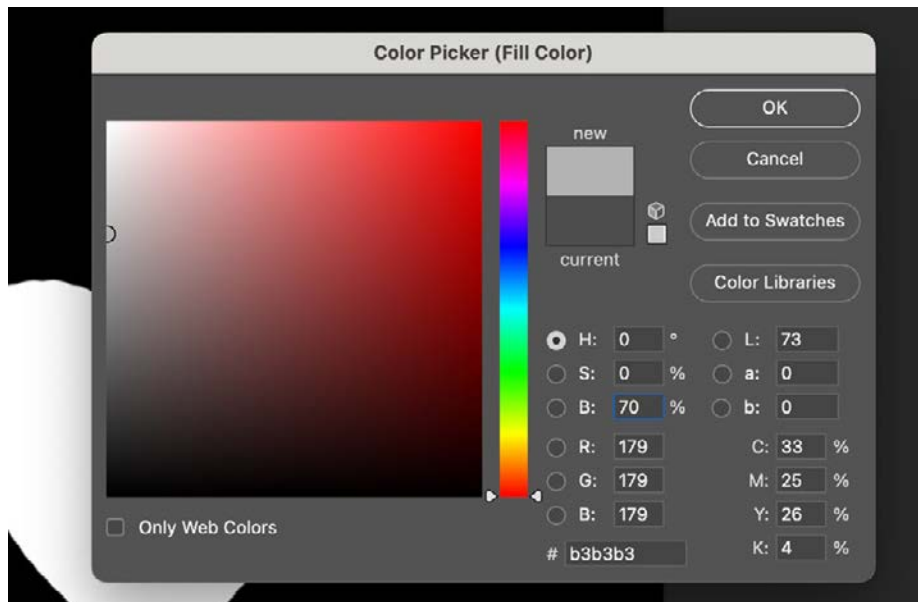


Reusable assets with Generative Fill

1. Draw something on a black background (I created a new document with black background and painted a really simple cloud).
2. Go to Quick Mask Mode (Q).



3. Go to Edit > Fill and then add a 70% grey fill.

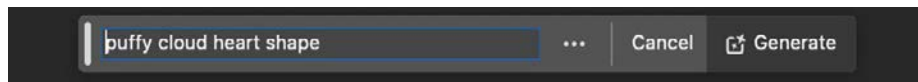


8. Go to Image > Adjustments > Levels to make sure all the blacks are really black.



4. Exit Quick Mask Mode (Q). You now have a selection with 70% opacity. Generative Fill will now use 30% of the underlying layer.

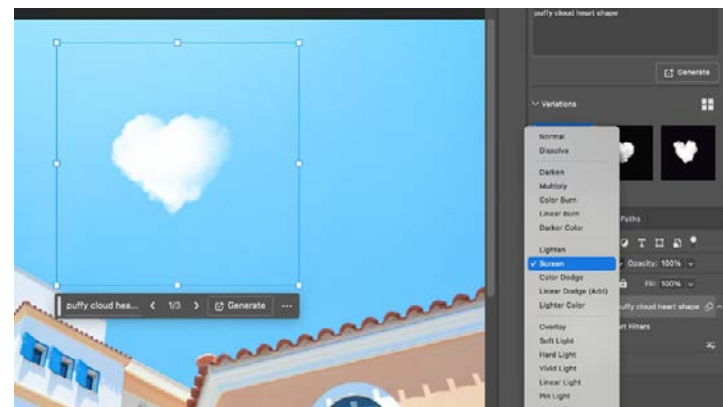
5. Click Generative Fill and type your prompt. Something like: puffy cloud with heart shape (in this case), but also circular lightning, mist, and so on.



6. Press Return or click Generate.

7. Choose the desired variation.

9. Copy your generated layer to another photo and use Screen blend mode to hide the blacks, and overlay the lighter colors.
